Now therefore be it resolved, that application be and is hereby made to the State Highway Commission for aid under said act for the construction, grading and drainage of that section of road leading from Pleasant Grove to Schooleys Mountain, in the township of Washington County of Morris, State of New Jersey, for a distance of 2 1/4 miles or such portion thereof as may be approved by the State Highway Commission.

The Township of Washington has authorized the additional sum of three thousand 3,000.00 for its portion of the cost.

with the provisions of the state law. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman Present John D. Burn Stewart Neighbor C. J. Trimmer Frank F. Koughlight Clerk.

The Chairman ordered the Clerk to read the notice calling a public hearing on the Local Budget and Tax Ordinance for the year 1919. The Clerk read the following notice and state that the notice and budget as approved by the Committee on the 15th day of January, had been published as required by law.

#### Notice

Notice is hereby giving that the Township Comm of the Township of Washington, County of Morris and State of New Jersey, pursuant to the requirements of an Act concerning Municipal and County Finances (Chapter 192, Laws of 1917, and the supplements and amendments thereto, did on the 15th day of January, 1917 approve the following Local Budget for the fiscal year of 1919 and ordered a public hearing to be held thereon on the 1st day of Feb, 1919, at the meeting room of said Committee, in the School House at Long Valley, in said Township, at two o'clock P.M. as in said act required when and where objections to said budget may be presented by any taxpayer of said municipality.
